BRENT COUNCIL REPORT

FROM CONSERVATIVE LEADER CLLR JOHN WARREN

■ **Yet again, we have proposed a budget with a Council Tax cut: this time 3%. Yet again, Labour chose an increase of 4%. There is no need for this increase — Brent has pots of money!**

■ **Our proposed budget highlights:**

- **Invest £3.5m extra in adult social care** to look after our elderly and vulnerable, compared to Labour's £2.1m.
- **Scrap Labour's green bin tax.**
- **Save £1m from Brent's press office.**
- **Re-instate lollipop men and women.**
- **Retain the popular free bulky waste service**, which Labour are set to charge for.
- **Scrap Labour's trebling of visitor parking permit costs** from £1.50 to £4.50 a day.
- **Create a new carers' fund of £300,000.**

Labour continues to build up massive cash balances, which have significantly increased from monies raised from developers, new residents, and new businesses from new buildings around Wembley Stadium — just have a look next time you are in the area!
