Conservatives Solve St Crispins Close Bin Problems

Residents of **St Crispins Close** recently contacted me to let me know that many of you had missed your regular weekly bin collections. As a result of this error bins on the street were overflowing, causing mess and attracting vermin.

I am very happy to let you know that, by working with my Conservative councillor colleagues, I have ensured that your regular weekly bin collections will resume.

But unfortunately this will only continue until **1st April**.

This is because the Labour-run Council has agreed a new waste contract which slashes weekly bin collections in **St Crispins Close**. I fear that the mess and disruption which you have experienced recently is only a preview of what will come when collections are reduced to fortnightly.

Many of you will probably already be aware of the changes starting on **1st April**:

- Non-recyclable waste will only be collected once a fortnight.
- On collection day you will have to place your bins at the front boundary of your property, not on the pathway. If you don't, your waste won't be collected.
- The Garden Tax is introduced: you will need to register to have your garden waste collected and pay £75 a year for it.
